BCA Participates in Design Philadelphia



"Terror In The Gulf: Hope or No Hope," a BCA student film project premiered on Sunday, October 10, 2010 as part of a Design Philadelphia Art Exhibit.

Design Philadelphia, now running in its 6th year, is a ten day city-wide art event held October 7 - 17. The event showcased various forms of arts throughout the city in the form of architecture to interior design, fashion to product design and multi-media to graphic design. Our exhibit, "Origami Takes Flight" was a collaborative effort between Octo Design Group, a

graphic design firm, Skai Blue Media, a public relations firm and Root Branch Kids, a youth film program. The three firms partnered together to create an art exhibit that would raise awareness of the affects the BP oil spill had on gulf coast wildlife.

Ms. Wendy of Octo Design Group, held workshops at schools throughout the city including Blair Christian Academy to make origami birds out of white recycled paper stock donated by the Finch Paper Company.

The five thousand plus birds created by the students were then strung together to create a white backdrop. The backdrop was wrapped around the exterior of Ms. Wendy's office building at 803 S. 4th Street. On the evening of the event, our film "Terror In The Gulf: Hope or No Hope," was projected onto the building and screened continuously throughout the duration of the exhibit. The exhibit was viewed by hundreds and raised approximately \$2300 for the National Wildlife Federation.



Onlookers *oohed and aahed* at the exhibit as they had never seen anything so intricately made. One visitor commented that the film was very sad and that what's happening in the gulf is simply terrible. Students that participated in the making of the film included: Aliana Scott, Sidney Holmes, Alyssa Hollis, Michael Green, Indica Martin, DeJason Ellis, Tylere Thomasson, Brittany Clark, Alessandra Sistrunk, Mariah Brown, Kasey Clark, and Monica Smith.



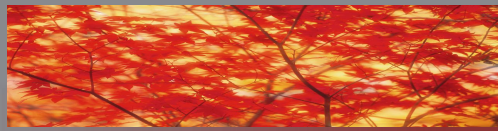

October 14, 2010 was the day the BCA gym was temporarily transformed into the Creation Museum. More than the visual enthusiasm, it educated and empowered the Kindergarten to Middle School BCA students with the knowledge that true Science and history reveals the grandeur of God's creation with proof from God's truth in His Bible. The exhibit started with informational talk from Project Director Sean Meek (seen below). The students then went around the array of visual and actual object/fossil displays that showcased the days of Creation, the fall, the flood, the Ice Age, cave men, dinosaurs, Jesus' crucifixion, dispersion of the human race at Babel, and the rise of civilizations. Finally, we learn that Science will always explain God's creation. Other than that, it is speculation, just like Evolutionism.

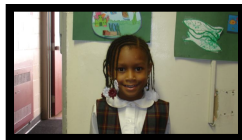

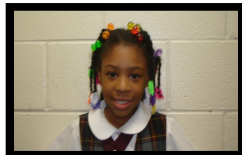

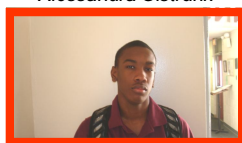
